

Information for Proposed Politics Majors in 2009-10 Transfer Students

We are pleased with your interest in Politics as your major. Following is some information we hope you will find helpful.

The Politics department offers both major and minor degrees as well as a Politics/Latin American and Latino Studies (LALS) combined major.

Readmits:

There have been a number of changes in the major that could affect you, depending on when you declared your major. The most notable is the replacement of the oral exam with various options for fulfilling the senior exit requirement. We will need to review your individual record at the office and discuss your future options.

Junior Transfers:

If you completed a lower-division Politics course at another institution and the Admissions Office accepted it as a transferable credit, Politics will accept it (when you officially declare your major) to fulfill one of the two required lower-division courses. We encourage to complete and pass with a grade of C or better the 2nd lower division course requirement in your first quarter. This will allow you to officially declare the major. Many of our courses restrict enrollment to declared majors.

Declaration of Major:

Declaring the major in Politics is a four-step process:

1. Complete and pass with a grade of C or better the 2 required lower division courses, numbered 1-79. Print a **Study Plan – Declaration of Major/Minor** form that can be found at <http://advising.ucsc.edu/student/index.html>. Complete the *University, General Education, and College Requirements* section and obtain approval from your college advisor.
2. Register for and attend a Politics department major declaration workshop led by the student advisor. The workshop schedule and registration form is posted outside of Merrill College, room 23. At the workshop you will be given all the information needed to be a successful Politics major.
3. Meet with your faculty advisor. Each student meets with a faculty member to discuss an intended program of study; including its breadth and purpose.
4. Meet with the Politics student advisor. Your declaration will be complete and entered into the Academic Information System (AIS).

Major Requirements:

The Politics course requirements for a major include: two lower division courses, four upper division core courses, five upper division electives and fulfilling one of the senior exit requirements.

Minor Requirements:

The Politics course requirements for a minor include: four upper division core courses plus one other upper division course of your choice.

Combined Politics/Latin American and Latino Studies (LALS) Major Requirements:

The Politics/LALS combined major course requirements offers a unique curriculum that combines courses from both the Politics and LALS depts. For further information regarding this

course of study, please contact the LALS advisor.
