UCSC Undergraduate Aid Philosophy


- Provide access & choice regardless of economic circumstances
- Prioritize grant aid to students with the most financial need
- Meet full financial need if possible
- Utilize scholarship funds to meet remaining need and to reduce loans and/or work-study

Financing a UC Education is a Partnership


- 1. Parents (based on FAFSA information)
- 2. Students are expected to contribute by working, taking student loans & applying for private scholarships
- 3. UC provides grant funding from fee income
- 4. UC campuses raise scholarship funds

We create "a package" of different types of aid for each student from federal, state, UC and other sources depending upon eligibility

2007-2008 Aid Recipients




2008-2009 Undergraduate Gift Aid



Total Estimated Gift Aid - \$78,814,000







Total Estimated UCSC Scholarships - \$3,000,000

Federal Aid Program Changes

- Federal Student Loans increased \$2,000
- Two New Federal Grants for Pell Grant eligible students:
 - Academic Competitiveness Grant(ACG) Frosh & Sophomores
 - National Science and Mathematics
 Access to Retain Talent (SMART)
 Grants Juniors and Seniors



Federal ACG/SMART Grants

ACG

- \$750 for 1st year students with high school GPA of 3.0 or higher
- \$1,300 for 2nd year students with cumulative 3.0 GPA at the beginning of their 2nd year


SMART Grants

- \$4,000 3rd & 4th year students
- Must have 3.0 cumulative GPA each term
- Must major in physical, life, or computer sciences, engineering, mathematics, technology, or a critical foreign language (CIP codes used)


The Application Process

- 1. March 2nd File the FAFSA by this date to be considered for all types of aid administered by UC Santa Cruz
- 2. March 9th FA Office begins posting verification requests for admitted students
- 3. May 1st FA Office begins posting verification requests for current students
- 4. June 15th Deadline for all financial aid applicants to submit all items on their MyUCSC To Do List in order to be considered for all types of aid administered by UC Santa Cruz

Addressing Current Issues

- Families are facing loss of employment this year
- Families facing loss of their home
- Value of rental property dropping
- How we address income loss
- We are pro-actively contacting students who have charges on their bills and aid they haven't accepted
- Still time to apply for the current year

Partners in Financial Education

- Accepting student loans avoid late fees
- Money management and budgeting
- Minimize credit cards
- Opt out of health insurance if already covered
- Distinguish between "need" and "want"
- Sign up for direct deposit with SBS
- Buy used books sell books
- Use Career Center services
- Work as residential assistants

Citizenship Issues

- Parent is undocumented but student is a citizen or permanent resident – student is eligible
- Students who are undocumented are not eligible and are in crisis
 - No public funding exits for these students yet we know there are a significant number on campus
 - They are using desperate methods to survive
 - Student Affairs leadership is working hard to find solutions such as private foundation funding
 - Financial Aid website contains links to scholarships students can apply for
