

Students are admitted to UCSC with a "proposed major" in most cases, and later petition to officially declare the major. Admission to UCSC does not guarantee acceptance into a particular major. Junior transfer students must be officially declared in a major by the deadline in their second quarter of enrollment.

Major: PHILOSOPHY

Qualification requirements and/or prerequisites for the major:

Students must have taken or currently be enrolled in at least one philosophy course in order to declare the major or minor.

Transfer students who intend to pursue this major should do the following prior to the beginning of their first term...

- ❑ Students who wish to receive credit for prior lower division college work should email a copy of their unofficial transcript to mjohnst4@ucsc.edu. Generally, equivalent introductory courses taken elsewhere are accepted in substitution for UCSC philosophy introductory courses (except Introduction to Logic, which must be taken at UCSC). Upper-division courses taken at four-year universities may be transferred by petition.
- ❑ For upper-division petitions, please submit a class syllabus and/or reading list, which will be reviewed by the Undergraduate Program Director.

...and should take these courses their first term:

PHIL 9: *Introduction to Logic*, and
PHIL 100A: *Ancient Greek Philosophy*

If unable to enroll in courses listed above:

Skills important for success in this major:

Critical reading skills, analytical writing abilities, formal and logical reasoning, abstract thinking, philosophical analysis, etc.

Other information:

Please note that the two required History of Philosophy courses must be taken at UCSC.
